Genesis launched its Sustainability Framework in FY19 and it has evolved due to our supportive network around the country driving this activity to progress towards a more sustainable future. The Framework sets goals and tracks performance beyond purely financial metrics, showing how Genesis is making long-term contributions to the environment, communities and the national energy sector.

Due to the unavailability of electric or hybrid utes in the New Zealand market, Genesis is unlikely to meet its goal of a 100% electric or hybrid light vehicle fleet by the end of 2020. Genesis remains committed to achieving this goal as soon as possible and will have all other light vehicles transitioned by the end of this calendar year.
