



**K**A HĪ AKE te rā ki runga i te pāmu iti o Maaka. Ka huaki ia i te tatau o tōna whare manu, ehara, kua oma mai te whānau pūkeko ki te tūtaki i a ia. Ko *Kō* te ingoa o te māmā, nō te kupu pūkeko. 
I te mānukanuka a Māmā Kō, me te whakautu atu, “E, kāore ā mātou kaitiaki pīpī”.

Ka āta nanao iho a Mark ki te rarawhi me te hoatu i a rāua ki tētahi māhangā. He kaiwhakangungu kararehe ia, ā me **tino** manawanui ia. He mea ako ngā kararehe e Maaka ki te whakatau i ngā mahi nanakia i roto i ngā kiriata me ngā pānui pouaka whakaata. He mea whakaoreore tēnei i te whiore o tana kuri, i a Kōtingotingo, i haere tahi ai me ia ki hea noa, ki hea noa.





“Kei te *mahi tūmatarau* pea a māmā?” te ui a Kahurangi i tata tāpukengia ai e te hei o te papa māhanga.


I muri kē a Kōtingotoing e hari ana i te haerenga.

“Nō hea te hi—te hiko?” te pātai a Ngutu i tō rātou taenga ki tētahi whare rākau.



“Ei, anei rā a Maggie, nō Genesis Energy...”





“Kua rawaka ana te haratau mō tēnei rā,” te kōrero a Maaka.


“Ka hoki mai ki te tango rīpene ā tērā wiki.”





*Tino* hiamo *rawa* ngā pīpī. Tē taea hoki tō rāua manawawera te pēpēhi iho kia wawe mai te rā hira. Whākina haeretia e Ngutu ūna hoa katoa. Ka karangahia ia e rātou ko **Kerebunga** te whetū kiriata! Taka rawa mai te rā, ka tae moata anō a Maaka. I whakaaetia hoki kia haere a Kōtingotingo i runga i

te whakahau ka noho tonu ki runga i te taraka. Ka whakarākai a Ngutu i a ia kia pai ai ūna huruhuru. Warea katoatia a Kahurangi e te moe. I pātai a Māmā Kō kia mōhio ia ki te whakaaturanga pouaka whakaata. “**Te pūngao, tiakina**,” te kī a Maaka. Tē aro i a Kō me ana pīpī. A Kōtingotingo, i wāna nei, he kōwaha noa tana kai.


Tae rawa ake ki te whare, *wheowheo ana* te haere!


“Te *ti-a-ki* pūngao?” te papepape a Ngutu. “He aha rā tērā whaea Maggie?”


“He pūngao *whakahou* te rā, pēnā me te hau,”

“Ka rata au ki tōu pōtae,” te kī a Kahurangi.  
Ka unuhia e Maggie ka hoatu ki a ia. Pakaru mai  
te kata i a rāua ka mātaki ake a Kahurangi i raro i  
te pōtae.





“He mea waihanga tēnei whare e te rākau, engari ia he pai ake te **porokere**, te **raima** me te **papa iti** hei tiaki pūngao nā te mea ka **ngongo** i te hana o te rā i ngā rangi. Mā te pēnei ka mahana tonu tātou i te ekenga o te pō me tōna mātao. Ka mahana hoki tātou i ngā hihi o te rā ka pā mai ki ngā **matapīhi**,” te kōrero a Maggie.

Ka hoki rātou ki roto.



*...whakamahia he puru aukati kauanu ki raro i ngā tatau hei poro i te kauanu, hei aukati i te putanga o te hau mahana...*




*...mā te pūngao e wera ai ō tātou kāinga me te waiwera... kaua rā tātou e moumou!"*


“Kia pai mai ka **kanikani** pea ahau ā taua wā? Ka **waiata rānei?**” te ui a Kō.
